The conference was attended by 680 people from 73 countries.

The cultural diversity of the delegates was one of the special aspects of the event. Attenders had the opportunity to get to know and share information with women with very diverse experiences of being a female police worker as well as with some delegates not working in the police or not women.

Promoting the IAWP Conference 2016 in Barcelona














The stand in the Exhibition Hall

The Barcelona Night

As is customary at IAWP conferences, an event to promote the Barcelona conference was organised.

Tiger Tiger was the place offered by the conference organisers. We gave a scarf to everybody, like the ones worn by the participants in human towers as they arrived, and we explained their significance.

We also gave a leaflet about the kind of cava they would taste. A rose Cava from Canals & Canals from Castellví de Rosanes, which was recognized as the best in 2014, and in 2015 was chosen for the occasion.

offered a glass of the drink to toast the 2016 conference.

The IAWP/ENP Conference Director 2016, gave a toast to policewomen in the world and invited people to go to Barcelona next year while the song Barcelona. sung by Montserrat Caballe and Fredy Mercury played in the room.

This was followed by Catalan music with pictures of Barcelona, and dancing to Rumba Catalana, following the instructions of a Barcelona policewoman, which proved to be a great success.

The Opening Ceremony

This took place in the main theatre in the St David's centre and was attended by delegates wearing uniform. There were speeches given by senior police officers and the Deputy Mayor of Cardiff, who finished with some words in Bengali for the Bangladeshi participants (he is of Bangladeshi origin).



During the ceremony two officers, one from Sri Lanka and the other from India, were presented with scholarships. The scholarship takes the form of their registration fee and all expenses involved in attending the conference being covered by the IAWP Foundation.

The two women were chosen for their exceptional work in policing in their countries and both gave very moving and inspirational speeches.

The Parade

The delegates walked from St David's centre to Cardiff Castle where they had photos taken with people from their region and then marched to the Motorpoint Arena for the Awards Lunch.

Although the ceremony and parade were formal in the sense that everybody in uniform. was and atmosphere was very warm
























The Cultural Night
